Halau Now Enrolling New & Returning Students for its 2012 Semester of Classes. New Classes to Open in Anahola, Kilauea and Lihu`e

Halau Palaihiwa O Kaipuwai - under the direction of Kumu Hula, Kehaulani Kekua is now accepting applications for new and returning students for its 2012 Semester of classes in hula study. Classes will open in Anahola, Kilauea and Lihu`e for keiki, kane, wahine and kupuna. Opportunity to enroll keiki as young as 3 years old is now available as well. No experience is required.

Established in 1945, the hālau is directed through traditional teachings of `aiha`a and hula that has been maintained over generations of matrilineal succession of Hawaiian cultural practice. Formal instruction and training in `aiha`a and hula include all forms of Hawaiian chant and dance, including study of traditional Hawaiian protocol, history and cultural perspectives. A low-impact, informal and enjoyable beginning hula `auana class for adults will also be added in the new semester.

Prospective students must be able to commit to the halau's schedule of classes and its extended calendar of curriculum activities.

Deadline for Registration Forms & Tuition Commitments

Application forms and requirements postmarked no later than Friday, December 30, 2011 will be entitled to an early registration discount. Final deadline to register is Wednesday, January 11, 2012. Applicants will be contacted upon receipt of their submitted forms and requirements for confirmation of class location and schedule(s). All new and returning students, as well as parents or guardians of minor children will be required to attend a mandatory orientation in January 2012. The halau's history, standards and procedures, calendar of events, retreats and workshops will be shared. Practice uniforms will also be distributed at the orientations.
